We are currently in the process of restructuring our Environmental Division after the departure of our Environmental Health Director. There were **205** pertussis vaccines provided at the clinic!













Type of Inspection, by Township, 2018




Rabies

In August 2018, CCGHD was notified by the Ohio Department of Health that a raccoon that had been sent to them was positive for rabies. This was the first positive case that CCGHD has had. This initiated a public health response, involving a multitude of partners. Partners that were involved in the rabies investigation included: Carroll County Emergency Management Agency, Sherrodsville Mayor Moffet, Ohio Department of Health, United States Department of Agriculture— Wildlife Services, and Carrollton Animal Hospital. We appreciate everyone's involvement in the mitigation of rabies. Carroll County ended 2018 with the first three confirmed raccoon rabies.
